Our History



Since its establishment, over 80 years ago, St Mollerans' GAA Club has developed exponentially.

When the club first formed in **1942**, under the name St Mollerans, it had no grounds, no clubhouse, no Juvenile branch and no field.

Training was held in Bob Sheehan's field and players togged off in the front room of Mrs Bridget Cleary's house at 39. Saint Mollerans.

Success first came in **1947** by way of a Junior Eastern title. **1959** brought both a Minor County Title and a Junior Football County Championship.

Success continued into the **60's**, when the club did the triple and won both hurling and football at junior level, as well as a Minor Eastern final.

The **70's** started with so much promise when St. Mollerans were crowned Intermediate Hurling Champions in **1970**. In **1971**, we were narrowly beaten in a Senior County Final replay.

In **1995**, St Mollerans' won the Eastern and County Intermediate Hurling Championships and **1996, 2000** and **2002**, saw the Club win the Eastern Junior Football Championship.

In **2004** and **2007**, we also brought the County Junior Football Championship back to Carrick Beg and in 2008, we were again Eastern Intermediate Hurling Champions.

Continuing to thrive ...



In **2005**, the **Field Development Programme** began.

Improvements made to the field and grounds, included the levelling of the pitch, the installation of all-weather lights and the perimeter fence and the resurfacing of the car park.

Overall the **Field Development Programme** made our grounds a safer, more functional and more accessible environment to play the sports we love.

With the renewal of the field and grounds came something of a revival of our Juvenile Branch.

St. Mollerans' competes at every age level from Minor to U11 in both hurling and football. Our Academy welcomes children from 5 years of age and sees huge turnout every week.

The club continued to expand even in the midst of the Covid-19 Pandemic, as 2021 saw the re-establishment of our Camogie Club, which three years on, fields teams from U6 to U15.

Presently, between the Adult and Juvenile Clubs, across Football, Hurling and Camogie, our pitch caters to 22 separate teams and what has become clear to everyone involved, aside from the immense pride each of our members take in playing for their club, is that we need to develop our Club facilities.
